Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)  • Presentation Rebecca Gillam, PhD, KUCPPR Laura Rice, LMSW  • Discussion Connie Satzler & KMCHC	Ms. Gillam introduced Laura Rice, LMSW. Ms. Rice presented on the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study (ACES). This study looks at the lasting effects for negative childhood experiences and how that effects health in later years in life. The Study looked at relationships with different poverty levels and the Public Health Implications. Book suggestion: Childhood Disrupted: How Your Biography Becomes Your Biology and How You Can Heal.  Brain Development – looked at brain development based on experiences and interactions.  Toxic Stress – normal kinds of stress (meeting new people, studying for a test) and then there is Toxic Stress (prolonged activation of stress). Toxic Stress is a strong, frequent and a prolonged adversity experience.  Discussion Items:  Baby Buffer website includes information and videos, under Brain Science, Still Face Experiment video.  Early Learning in the Kansas Plan.  Resilience – group discussion on what resilience means Hope Theory  Faith Based Organizations and their involvement.  Ms. Gilliam presented ACES and MCH state plan. She reviewed Priority 5 & 6 and the existing work in Kansas.  Discussion Items:  Screening tools – ASQ, PHQ9, Edinburgh Postpartum  Depression.
