Top health issues affecting adolescents in Kansas, as reported in 2015¹:

Health care provider diagnosis of anxiety disorder in youth under age 17 is going up, from **3.5%** 10 years ago to **4.1%** today. **80%** of children with an anxiety disorder never receive treatment. Current anxiety worldwide in children and adolescents is **7%**, according to a 2015 meta-analysis of 41 studies from 27 countries².



In social anxiety disorder, earlier age of onset is linked to more severe anxiety later. **Youth with social anxiety disorder are 3 times more likely to experience depression!**

Average age of onset, based on 24 studies composed of 11,000 young people²:



Separation anxiety disorder: 11 years



Social anxiety disorder: 14 years




Specific phobia: 11 years

Youth Mental Health is Worsening and Access to Care is Limited³:



In a five year period, rates of severe youth depression have increased from 5.9% to 8.2%. **More than 1.7 Million Youth with Major Depressive Episodes DID NOT receive treatment, that's enough to fill every major league baseball stadium on the east coast TWICE.**


On the State of Mental Health in America report **62% of female youth scored moderately severe depression or severe depression. 52% of male youth.** On average, it takes 10 years between the onset of symptoms and when individuals receive treatment³.

During the 12 months before the survey, among Kansas high school students⁵:



Felt sad or hopeless almost everyday for two weeks or more in a row, so that they stopped doing some usual activities



Seriously considered attempting suicide



Made a plan about how they would attempt suicide



Attempted suicide one or more times
