Base Funding Formula

- Number of children 0-22 years in the community
- Number of children in poverty under 18 years of age in the community
- Number of females 23-44 in the community

The State Title V Challenge

- Access to programs across the state is not equitable and there are large health inequities in the state
- Recent needs assessments noted that families are struggling to get their basic needs met
- Increases in behavioral health concerns such as mental health disorders, substance use, excessive alcohol use, suicides and intimate partner violence
