Public Input

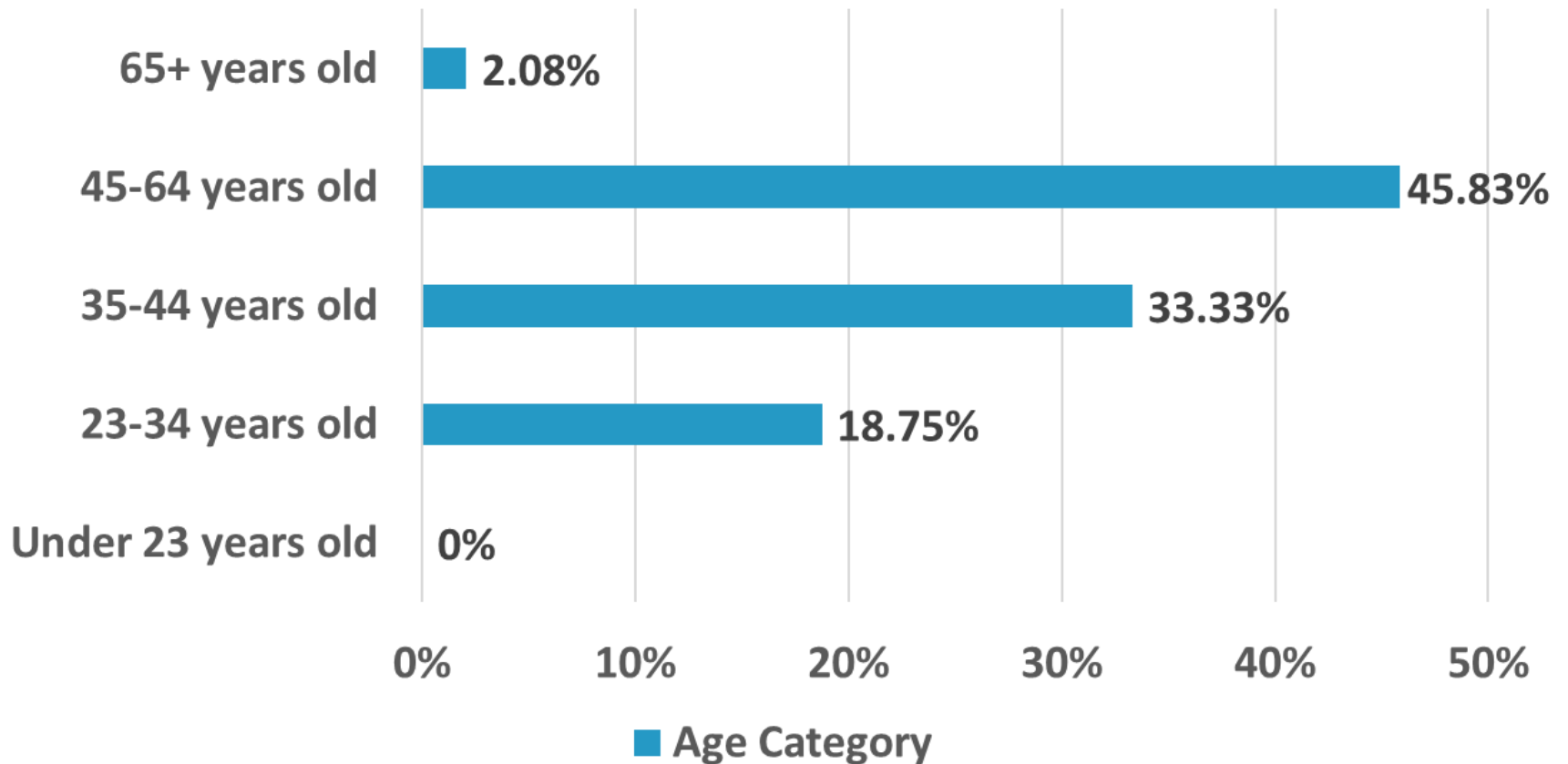
Each year, the Kansas Title V MCH Block Grant Report and Application is posted for public feedback.

Public Input Period: June 3 – June 27.

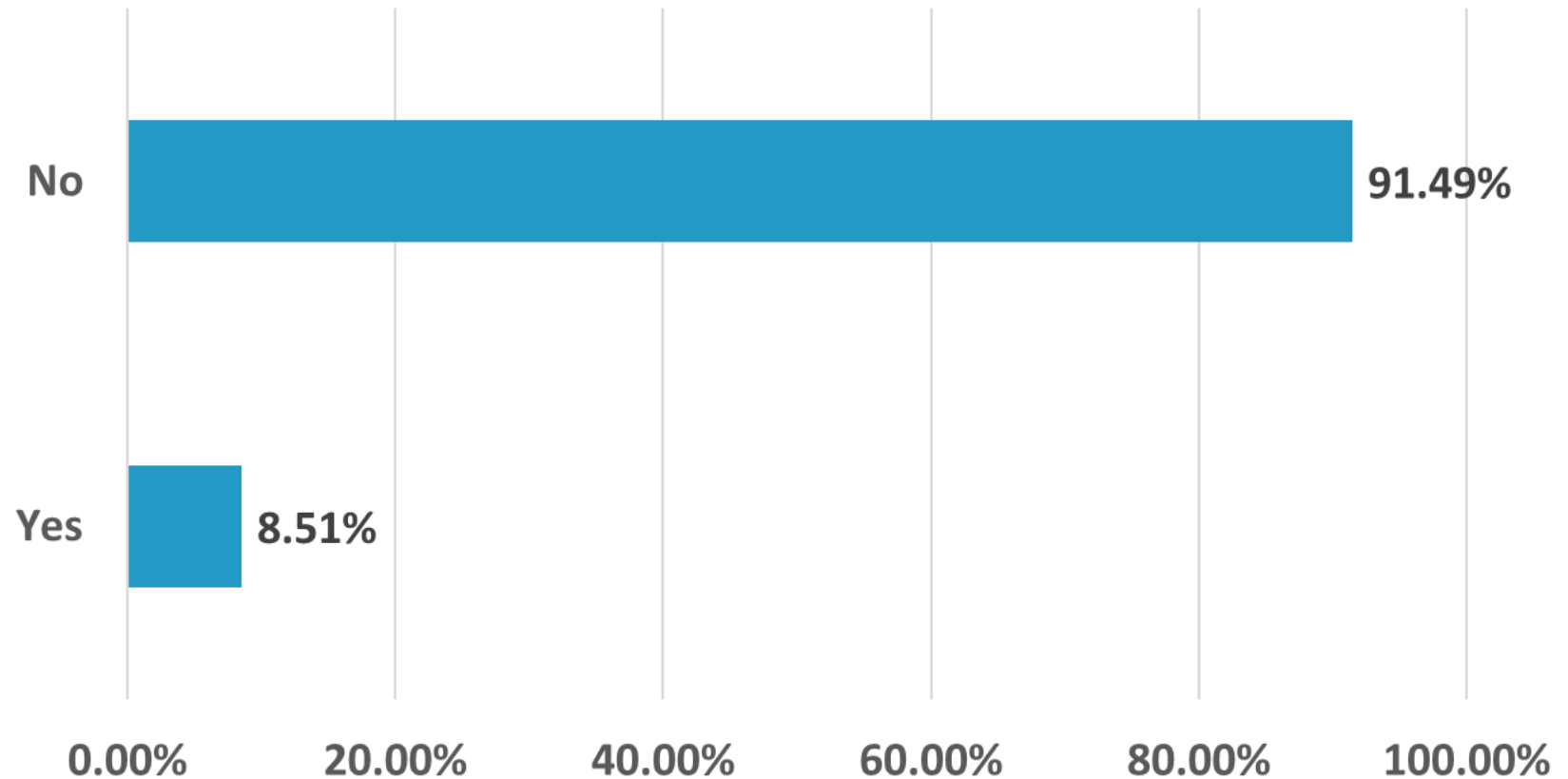
Total Responses: 48 (higher than the 29 received last year).



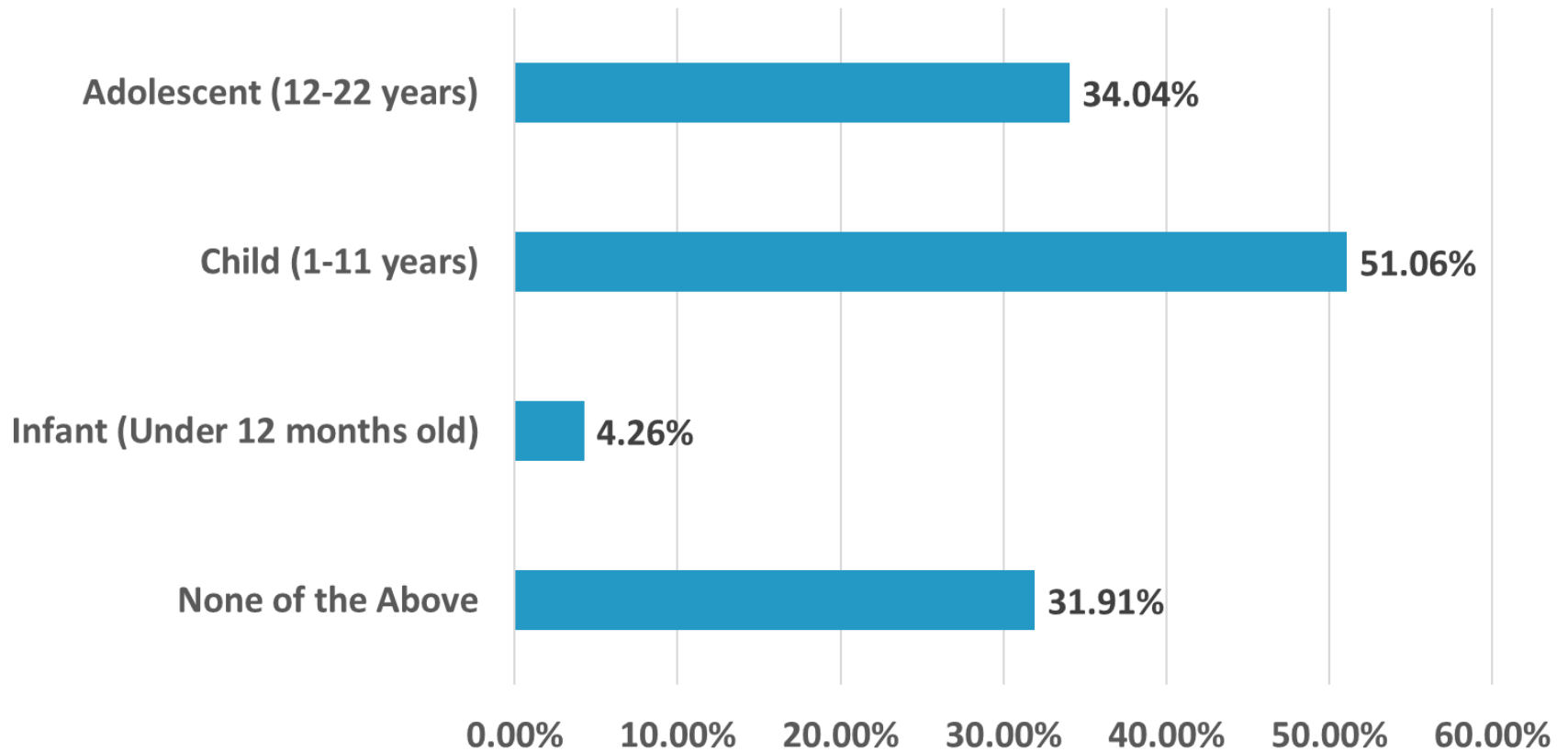
Responses by Age Category



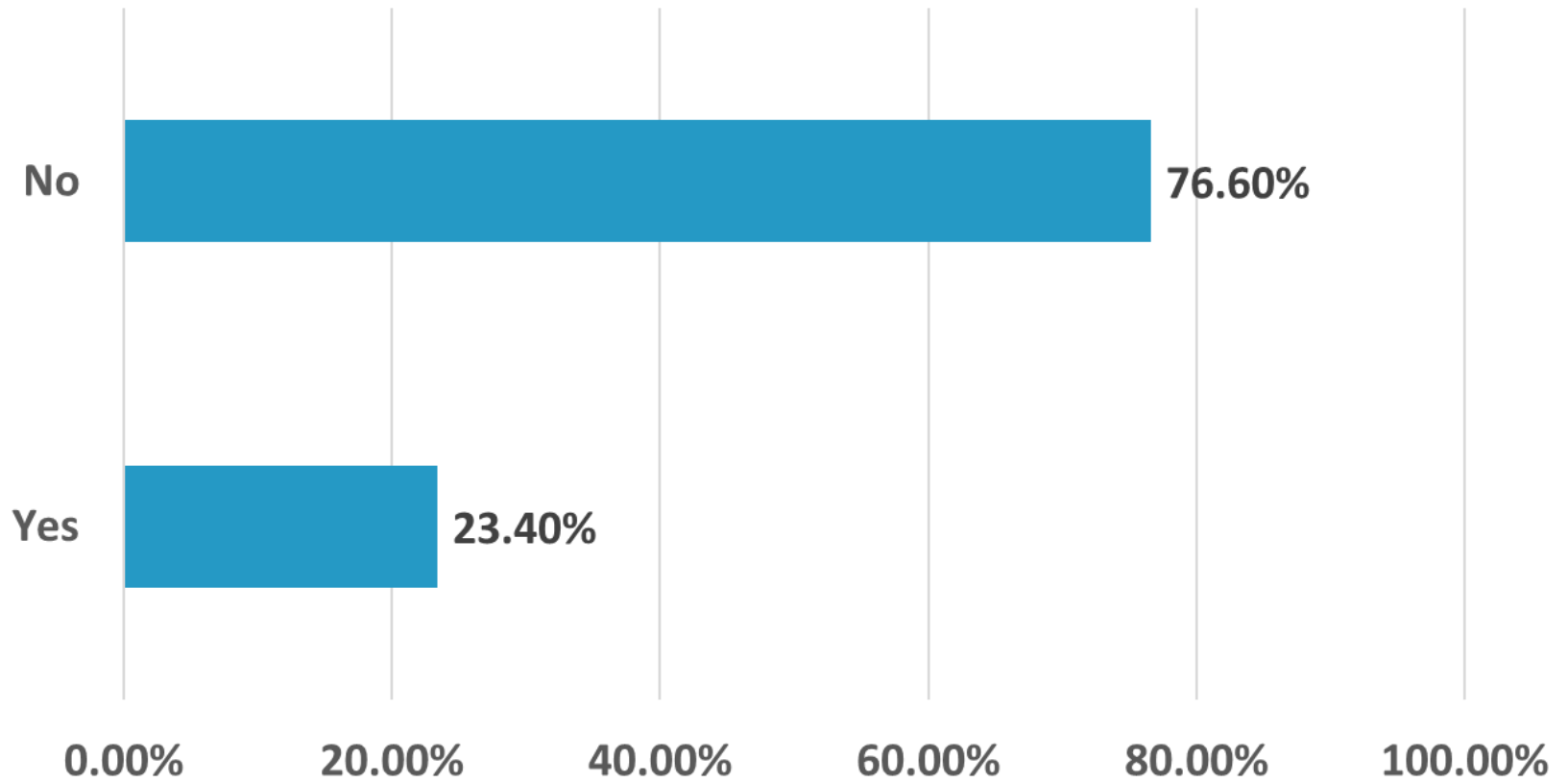
Are you currently pregnant, or have given birth or experienced a pregnancy loss within the past 12 months?



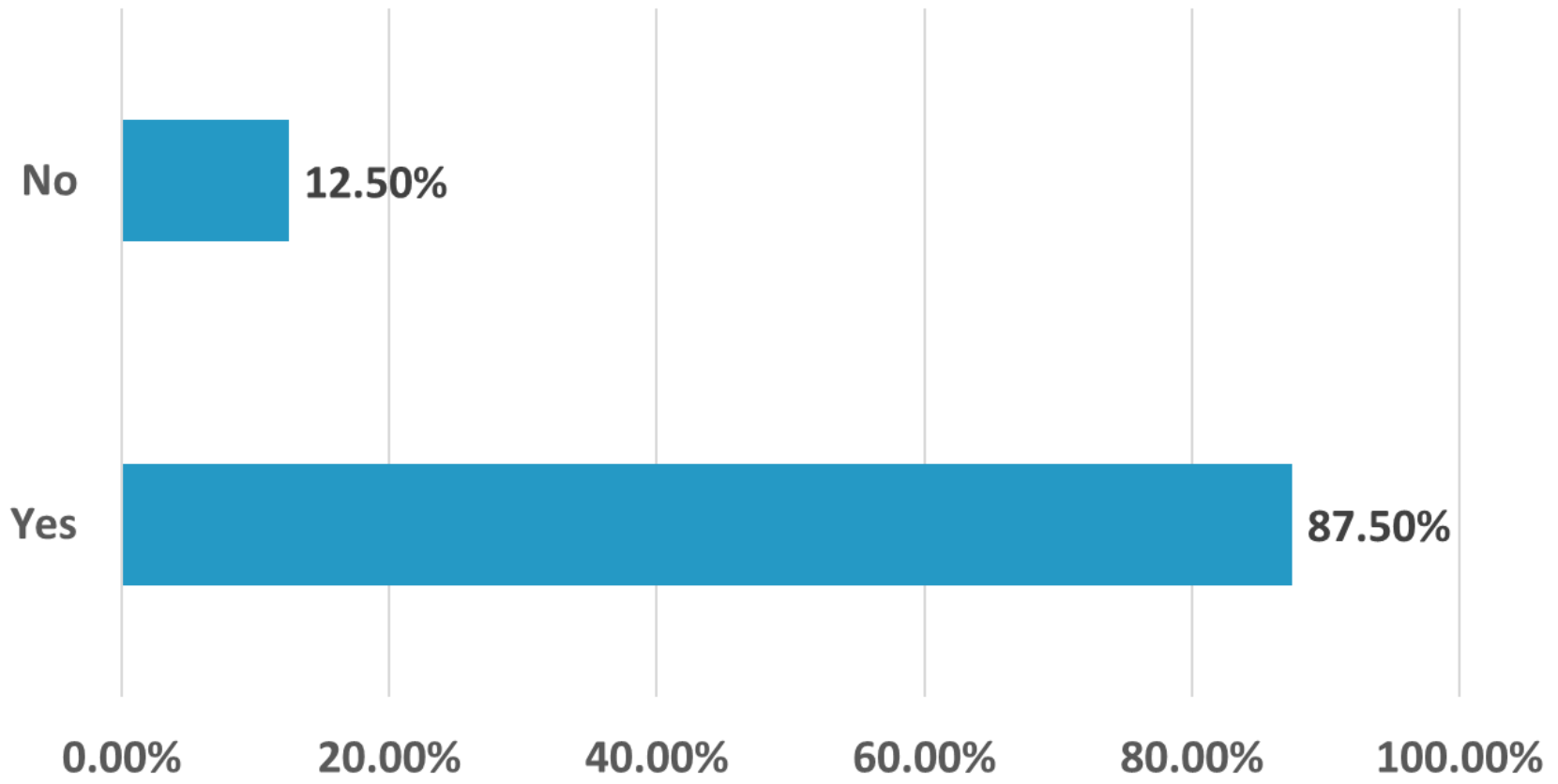
Are you a parent or guardian for any of the following?
