<p>Welcome & Introductions <i>Dennis Cooley, MD, Chair</i></p>	<p>Dr. Cooley welcomed the KMCHC members. New members were introduced.</p>	
<p>Review & Approval of March 30, 2016 Minutes <i>Dennis Cooley, MD, Chair</i></p>	<p>It was moved by Ms. Daldrup and seconded by Ms. Yadrich to approve the 3/30/65 minutes. All approved.</p>	

<p>Title V MCH Needs Assessment & 2017 Application <i>Rachel Sisson</i></p>	<p>Ms. Sisson presented the website for the Needs Assessment and asked KMCHC members to review and make comment. Comment Deadline is June 27, 2016</p>	<p>All KMCHC members will use the postcard that includes the Needs Assessment link to review and comment.</p>
<p>Life Course & Preconception Health Reports <i>Kari Teigen</i></p>	<p>Ms. Teigan presented on Life Course issues related to preconception health. She reviewed Indicators including ACES, CYSHCN, Medical Home, Tobacco, etc. and reviewed the Assessment Areas of Kansas. Kansas' highest risks: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Adults: highest is Obesity - Children: highest is Medical Home Ms. Teigan gave a pregnancy example of how preconception health relates to life course. She described the most common preconception health comparing Kansas with the U.S. A colored handout of her presentation was distributed. Discussion Items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Poverty appears to be the overlying issue for these indicators. - Prescription Drug problem – issue of prescription drug addicts moving to illegal drugs maybe due to cost. - Illegal Drug – is there data available. - Need to deal with the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study (ACES). - Data is fine, but need to include the perceptions of adults and children. Note: The slides from this PowerPoint are on the MCH website with some additional slides to review.</p>	<p>Ms. Teigan will look at the illegal drug data to report back to the KMCHC.</p>
<p>Action Plan Prioritization Results <i>Connie Satzler</i></p>	<p>Ms. Satzler reminded the members about the Kansas MCH website (see the web address at the top of the Minutes) She reported on the Action Plan results and reminded members to keep these in mind when moving forward with reviewing strategies and objectives. She presented the Results by each Domain and which priority scored the highest.</p>	<p>Chris will add the KS MCH website to the Agenda and Minutes for all future meetings.</p>
<p>Award: 2016 Excellence in State MCH Leadership Award <i>Heather Smith</i></p>	<p>Ms. Smith announced that Ms. Rachel Sisson was awarded the 2016 Excellence in State MCH Leadership Award. This has not been award in 3 years and is a very prestiges award for MCH Leadership.</p>	

<p>Special Health Care Needs Program & Population <i>Heather Smith and Kayzy Bigler, KDHE</i></p>	<p>Ms. Smith reminded the group to keep in mind the Special Health Card Needs population when looking at the Domain objectives and strategies. They reported on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Specialty and Outreach Clinics - Additional Satelite Offices - Strategic Plan – 5 main objectives & new Priorities Identified. - Care Coordination Pilot Program for SHCN population. To be spread statewide when training and the pilot program is completed. - Special Health Services (SHS) Family Adisory Council (FAC). - CYSHCN is part of all Domains. Looking at this population when considering objectives and strategies for each domain. - Gave examples of how to include CYSHCN in each of the Domain Priority Objectives. <p>Discussion Items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - How to include the incarcerated populations.

<p>MCH Population Domains: Small Group Discussion</p>	<p>Members broke into their individual Domain Groups to discuss their high ranking objectives and strategies.</p>	
<p>MCH Populations Domains: Group Reports</p>	<p>Each Domain gave a five minute report on their Small Group Discussions.</p> <p>Key Take Away Points – Top Priority Items</p> <p>Women/Maternal:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Review of Toolkit of Mental Health from the BAM program. Revising specifics of the toolkit. Discussion on a separate consent form to be developed. 	

- Also developing a Refusal Form – stating this would releasing liability from the provider.
- Each Community develop a resource list of mental health provider with fees, etc.
- They will meet electronically to move forward on some of these specific items before the next meeting.

Child:

- Addressing Developmental Screening – 1 month to 5 years old. Focus on KIDDOS program and activities completed.
- Sustaining activities and tools from the KIDDOS program.
- Develop a Survey.
- Improve coordination of care and home visiting, etc.
- Gap: develop more ways to communicate with providers on using standardized tools.
- Possible webinar to healthcare providers on best practices tools.
- Build MCH grantee database and more training opportunities.
- Develop parent marketing on Developmental Screening.

Perinatal/Infant:

- Prenatal Nutrition: focus on consisitant messaging.
- Discussion of available resources.
- Input from stakeholders on relevancy of message.
- BAM and WIC program efforts and how to expand.
- Educational sessions at conferences.
- Increase the number of referrals to WIC connect with Medicaid program on referrals.
- Hire a Breastfeeding Coordinator and market the Breastfeeding pier consulting program.
- Maintaining breastfeeding designation level or promote moving up a level.
- Marketing issues with promoting BAM.

Adolescent:

- Increase adolescent prevention visitis due to no requirements for school.
- Reaching out to schools and how to provide adolescent services in schools.
- FQHC involvement in adolescent.
- Increase the number of adolescents getting immunizations

A webinar with Phil Griffin will be set up for July or August to discuss and help answer VFC questions. - “Out of the Box” option - partnering with veterinarians about including child vaccine announcement on the pet immunization reminder cards. - <p>It was suggested that a physician from Children’s Mercy West be added to the KMCHC roster.</p>	<p>Rachel/Chris will send out date options for a VFC informational webinar with Phil Griffin at KDHE Immunization Program.</p> <p>Dr. Lauer will send information to Rachel and Chris on a possible KMCHC member from Children’s Mercy West.</p>
<p>PRAMS Grant Update <i>Greg Crawford, KDHE</i></p>	<p>Pregnancy Risk Assessment Management System (PRAMS). Mr. Crawford gave an update on the PRAMS grant. He announced that Ms. Kim worked on the pilot program that positioned Kansas to apply for the PRAMS funding that was approved! The goal is to get a 60% response rate on the survey. There is plans to link to many different datasets, i.e., hospital discharge, etc. More information will be forwarded as the PRAMS program progresses.</p>	
<p>Safe Kids Update <i>Cherie Sage, KDHE</i></p>	<p>Ms. Sage presented a Safe Kids update on the ATV Safety Education Program and a video. She provided several resources and asked members to contact her (CSage@kdheks.gov) if they were interested in these resources.</p>
