



# Contact Outreach/Monitoring

- 27 contact investigators started 7/20; to be trained and ready to conduct contact outreach and monitoring by 7/22
- Volunteer workforce will be phased out on 7/31
- Additional 23 contact investigators will start on 7/28
- Surge capacity will continue to be monitored and contact investigators will be onboarded weekly in groups of 25
- 15 case investigators have been onboarded and additional investigators can be added if needed

## CARES Act COVID Relief Funds

#### **SPARK\* Office of Recovery: SPARK Task Force & Committees**

**Goal:** Strengthening People & Revitalizing Kansas (SPARK) Task Force is charged with leading KS forward in recovery from the far-reaching effects of COVID-19. The SPARK Executive and Steering Committees, in conjunction with the Office of Recovery team, are responsible for the distribution of CARES Act funding.

#### <u>Proposals to SPARK Committee</u> (not including Eco-Devo & Connectivity)

Public Health: \$86M

- Preparedness & Mitigation \$23.9M
- Vulnerable Populations \$6.4M
- Nursing Homes \$23.6M
- Health Facilities \$16.6
- Mental Health \$12.5

#### Education: \$75M

- Early Childhood & Child Care \$9.9M (3 components)
- K-12, Community/Technical Colleges, Higher Ed \$65M
